CORNER IS LOCATED IN A FLAT AREA WITH ± 35 YEAR OLD D. FIR TO THE NORTHEAST AND WEST AND MIXED AGE AND TYPE TREES TO THE SOUTHEAST. TO REACH CORNER FROM THE INTERSECTION OF VAN HORN ROAD AND THE ALSEA-DEADWOOD HIGHWAY, TRAVEL NORTHERLY ALONG THE HIGHWAY FOR 0.24 MILES TO A TIMBER ROAD ON THE RIGHT. TURN RIGHT ONTO TIMBER ROAD AND FOLLOW FOR 0.04 MILES TO A WYE, STAY RIGHT FOR 0.34 MILES TO A WYE, TURN LEFT FOR 0.14 MILES AND PARK. WALK ABOUT 100 FEET SOUTH TO THE CORNER. 
8. FOUND D. FIR 20" DIA WITH HEALED FACE BEARS N27°54'W, 32.06 FEET TO CENTER. SET ALUMINUM NAIL AND PLASTIC WASHER IN NORTHEASTERLY BASE FOR DISTANCE MEASUREMENT.

(SET FIR 12" DIA BEARS N26°W, 32.2 FEET, MARKED "1/4 S24 BT" AS PER RECORD [15]).

MONUMENT SET (PROCEDURES AND DESCRIPTION):

FOUND 3-1/4" BRASS CAP MARKED AS SHOWN ON PAGE 3 OF 3, ON 2-1/2" IRON PIPE, FIRMLY SET AND UNDISTURBED, UP 2" ABOVE GROUND SURFACE, FOR THE CORNER. THE IRON PIPE AND BRASS CAP WERE SET IN 1989 BY STEPHEN D. HARDIN AND FRANK A. TUERS, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT (BLM) CADASTRAL SURVEYORS, OVER A 3/4" IRON PIPE SET IN 1931 BY WALTER W. LARSON, D.C.S. LARSON SET THE 3/4" IRON PIPE FROM A STANDING CEDAR AND A DOGWOOD STUMP THAT WERE MARKED IN 1891 BY ALONZO GESNER, D.S. GESNER DID NOT FIND ANY TRACES OF THE ORIGINAL GENERAL LAND OFFICE (GLO) CORNER ESTABLISHED BY DENNIS HATHORN, D.S., IN 1856, AND GESNER'S NOTES INDICATE THAT HIS REESTABLISHMENT OF THE 1/4 SECTION CORNER WAS AT THE MIDPOINT OF THE LINE BETWEEN SECTIONS CORNERS TO THE EAST AND WEST. HOLDING LARSON'S PIPE MAKES GESNER'S DISTANCE ALONG THE WEST HALF OF THE SECTION LINE ABOUT A CHAIN SHORT OF THE ACTUAL DISTANCE MEASURED BY OTHER SURVEYORS SINCE GESNER, AND LARSON'S PIPE IS ABOUT A HALF CHAIN SOUTH OF THE STRAIGHT LINE BETWEEN THE TWO SECTION CORNERS TO THE EAST AND WEST. LARSON'S DISTANCES TO THE TWO BEARING TREES WERE NOT GOOD IN COMPARISION TO GESNER'S DISTANCES. IT IS POSSIBLE THAT THE DOGWOOD STUMP THAT LARSON FOUND WAS NOT GESNER'S DOGWOOD STUMP. USING THE CEDAR ONLY WOULD HAVE PLACED THE CORNER FURTHER NORTHWEST AND WOULD HAVE PLACED THE CORNER CLOSER TO THE MIDPOINT BETWEEN THE SECTION CORNERS. BUT LARSON MAY HAVE FOUND EVIDENCE ON THE DOGWOOD STUMP THAT IS NO LONGER IN EXISTENCE. LARSON WAS THE DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR WHEN HE PLACED THE 3/4" IRON PIPE, ANOTHER DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, CURTIS C. HANSON, HELD THE 3/4" IRON PIPE, AND THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT SURVEYORS HELD THE 3/4" IRON PIPE FOR THE CORNER POSITION. THE 3/4" IRON PIPE POSITION HAS BEEN USED TO CONTROL THE SUBDIVISION OF THE SECTIONS NORTH AND SOUTH FOR OVER 90 YEARS. DUE TO LONG STANDING ACCEPTANCE AND USAGE OF THE POSITION OF THE 3/4" IRON PIPE AND ITS PERPETUATION, THE BRASS CAP AND 2-1/2" IRON PIPE WERE HELD FOR THE CORNER POSITION.

SET TWO NEW IRON ROD ACCESSORIES AS SHOWN ON PAGE 3 OF 3. FOUND WHITE FIBERGLASS POST 5" WEST OF BRASS CAP. SET 6 FOOT ORANGE CARSONITE "SURVEY MARKER" POST 1 FOOT NORTH OF BRASS CAP.

COMPASS DECLINATION IS 15° EAST. ALL MEASURED DISTANCES AND BEARINGS ARE TO THE CENTER OF THE OBJECT, UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. ALL BEARING TREES ARE PAINTED AND HAVE A B.T. TAG ATTACHED, FACING THE CORNER UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED. ALL NEW BEARING TREES HAVE A PLASTIC WASHER (STAMPED "SURVEY MARKER DO NOT REMOVE") ATTACHED BY AN ALUMINUM NAIL TO THE SIDE CENTER OF THE TREE FOR DISTANCE MEASUREMENT, UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED.


