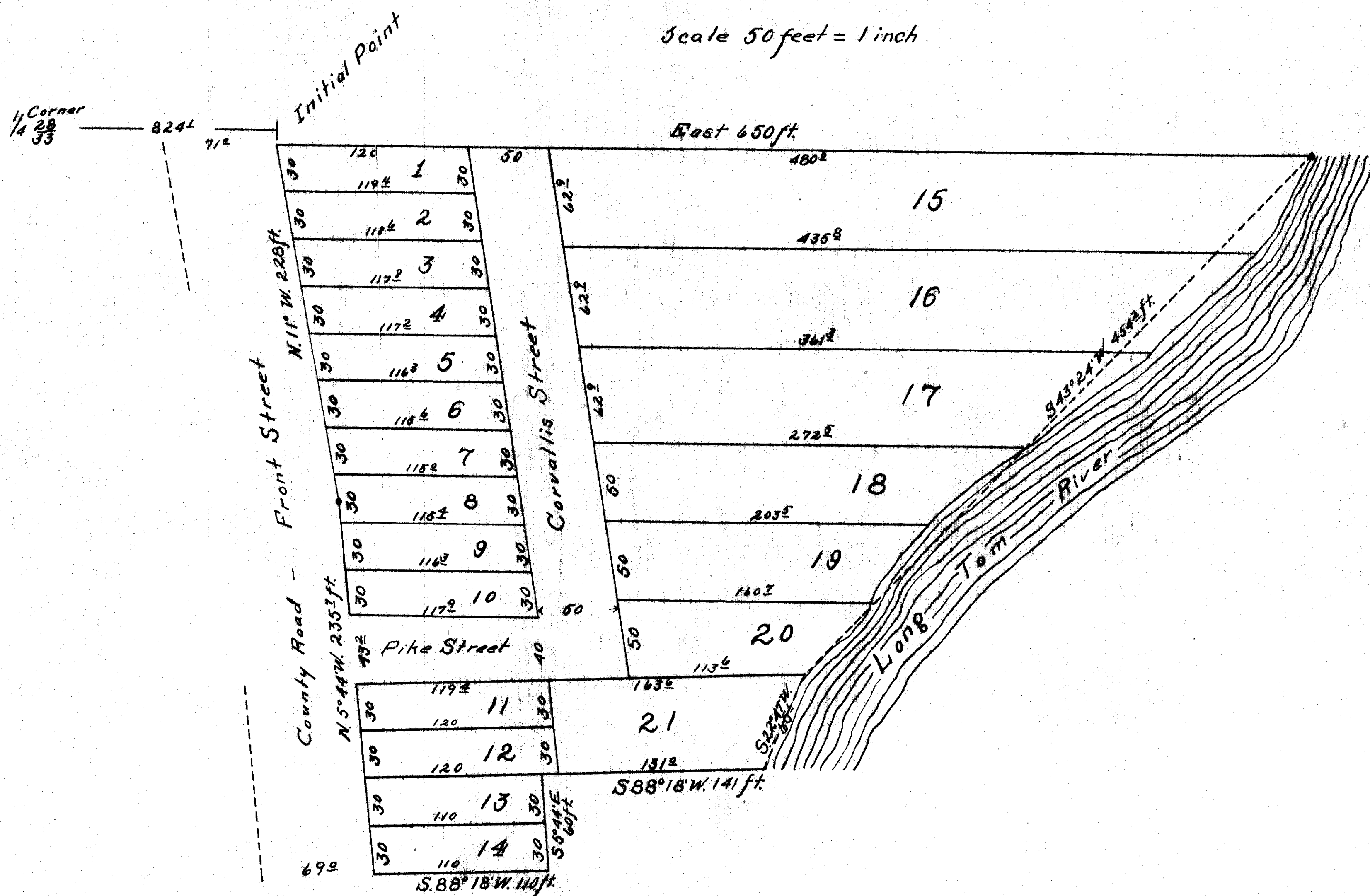


KEENEY'S ADDITION TO MONROE

Description. Keeney's Addition to the town of Monroe lies in the S.E. quarter of Section 33, T. 14S. R. 5W. and is described as follows. Beginning at a point, said point being a 2" iron pipe 3' long set 6" below the surface and being 824' feet East of 1/4 Section Corner between Sections 28-33, and running thence East 650 feet to Long Tom River, thence along bank of said river S. 43° 24' W. 450 feet, thence S. 22° 47' W. 65 feet, thence S. 88° 18' W. 141 feet, thence S. 5° 44' E. 60 feet, thence S. 88° 18' W. 141 feet, thence N. 5° 44' W. 235 feet, thence N. 11° 00' W. 228 feet to place of beginning.
